Literature Review - ENY 5006 Graduate Students Only

Graduate students are required to write a literature review based on a topic involving entomology. Examples of areas in entomology are; Biological Control of Insects, Insect Pest Management (IPM, Insecticides, agricultural crops, etc.), or Medical and Veterinary Entomology. Within your area you must focus your paper on a specific topic. Writing on Biological Control of Insects is too broad and must be narrowed down to a specific insect or system within that topic. You must choose a topic and submit it to the instructor before the first exam. The instructor will approve the topic or will suggest some alternate topics for the review. The literature review will consist of a **12 page**, typed (12 point font, 1.5 line spacing, 1.25" margins) paper with a minimum of 15 peer-reviewed journal article references. At least 5 of these articles must be the year 2001 or newer. This assignment will be due **before** the final exam (see syllabus schedule). If you have questions about what journal articles are acceptable, please ask. You can visit the UF library page and go to quick links to find great databases for articles. Try Science Direct to find some full articles online! If you are off campus, the UF library has information for remote use at http://web.uflib.ufl.edu/access.html. This assignment is worth 100 points! You will be graded on content and quality of sources as well as organization and format.

EXAMS

Exam Formats:

The exams are critical thinking questions that are made up of multiple-choice, matching, short answer and/or discussion questions. Exam1 (100 pts) will cover Units 1-5, exam 2 (100 points) will cover Units 6-10 and the Final Exam (worth 150 pts) will cover Units 11-15 combined with selected materials from Units 1-10. The final exam will be comprehensive and will be composed of 100 points of new material and 50 points of previous material. You will not be allowed to take any exam after the exam date unless prior arrangements have been made. Make-up exams will be given in emergency situations only and may not be in the same format as original exam given. Appropriate documentation of the emergency will be required.

Exam Downloading and Submission:

Exams will be posted on WebCT according to above class schedule. Exams are in a .doc format to be down-loaded from WebCT. the exam should be saved as a .doc or rtf file and must include your name. Completed exams are to be submitted back into WebCT on or before the scheduled deadline. STUDENT'S NAME MUST BE ON SUBMITTED EXAM (No Exceptions).
