


Fig 2. Number of pages published per volume, 1994 to date. The number of pages in the volumes for 1994 to 2000 were divided by 1.2 to make them equivalent to the larger pages in volumes 2001 forward. The number of pages for 2003 was estimated by doubling the number of pages in the first two issues. The dashed line is the average number of pages published in the years prior to the start of IFWA fees. Note that net income from IFWA fees, unlike gross income from library subscriptions, is dependent on the number of articles and scientific notes published (which is highly correlated with the number of pages published).
